The Ponce Inlet Fire Department (PIFD) responded to 93 incidents for the month of August, with 66 of the responses falling under the EMS category.

The fire department transported 53 patients in August: 28 transports from Ponce Inlet, 25 from out-of-district; the average number of transports in 24 hours was 1.8.

In August the fire department continued its firefighting skills training by practicing driver training of the fire apparatus and conducting hose deployment drills.

The department also visited various condominiums and commercial properties updating pre-fire response plans.

A Driver/Engineer promotional process was conducted with three employees competing for the position. Assessors from neighboring departments assisted as evaluators in the process. The final results of the process will be announced in September.

As we head into the peak of hurricane season, remember that it only takes one storm to impact the community. Individual storm preparations are essential to assure you are as prepared as possible for any event.

Fire Department turnout data is included with the other call related information. The fire department's goal is to have the 90<sup>th</sup> percentile time for both medical and fire calls meet the NFPA standards. In August, the fire department met the 90<sup>th</sup> percentile for fire responses. The 90<sup>th</sup> percentile for fire department EMS responses for August was close to the NFPA standard.

To provide the public with more fire department response data, we are including hyperlinks to heat maps of the various fire department responses. The intent of the heat maps is to demonstrate concentrations of calls within the community. This is a requirement of the accreditation process. Links to the heat maps can also be found on the Town's website under the fire department section.





### Counts by Incident Type








